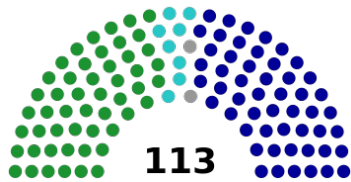

Overview of the 11th Legislative Yuan

While the inauguration of the new president is still months ahead, Taiwan’s unicameral legislature – Legislative Yuan (LY) welcomed its new members, as members of the 11th LY took office on 1 February and embarked on their 4-year journey as legislators of Taiwan.

The LY holds significant amount of discretion on the executive branch, with its power to legislate, budget, and inquire on state affairs. With the opposition Kuomintang leading the LY, difficult way ahead is expected for President-elect Lai, and the role for Taiwan People’s Party became more important than ever.
